

# Snow Day Activities and Learning Ideas.

<p>Investigate snowflakes – can you find two that look the same? Can you remember how many sides they have? Try using a black tray or black paper and a magnifying glass if you have one. Can you have a go at drawing a snowflake?</p>	<p>Create snow art – you could use paint or food colouring.</p> <p>Enjoy a warm drink while watching the snow fall and read your favourite stories together.</p>	<p>Explore making footprints in the snow and create different footprint trails. Try using shoes of different sizes and with different soles – whose is the biggest or the smallest?</p>
<p>Melting challenge – collect cups of snow and attempt to either stop the snow melting or make the snow melt as fast as possible.</p>	<p>Make snowballs of different sizes. You could attempt to build a snowball tower or throw snowballs at a target.</p>	<p>Instead of a mud kitchen, create a snow kitchen! Using pans, bowls, cups, spoons, whisks</p>
<p>Build a snowman, snow child, snow animal or snow building. (Try to find interesting things to use to dress it like – a hat, buttons, carrot, natural materials, ribbons, or spare clothing)</p>	<p>Try mark making or writing in and on the snow. You could use your feet, sticks, giant paintbrushes, pom-poms, or lolly sticks.</p>	<p>Draw a picture of someone dressed for a cold winter day and then label the clothes they are wearing to keep them warm and dry.</p>
