We have had a wonderful first half term in FS1. The children have all settled in well and are adapting quickly to routines and expectations. Thank you to everyone who are supporting the children with their Learning Diaries at home.

We have thoroughly enjoyed our topic of 'Marvellous Me' and talking about and drawing our families and homes and our likes and dislikes.







We have been reading the story 'The Colour Monster' which focuses on different emotions and we have discussed what makes us have different feelings, such as what makes us happy, sad or excited. The children have talked lots about what makes them happy, such as playing with their friends at school, their favourite sweets and ice-cream flavours and spending time with their families.

The children have focused on developing their writing skills through fine motor activities such as Dough Disco and 'Squiggle Whilst You Wiggle' which involves 'flipper flappers' and lots of different dance moves to support gross motor development. The children enjoy picking the music to accompany our sessions and have made fantastic progress so far.











Our children have lots of time to explore our continuous provision, engaging in learning both indoors and outdoors. We have also enjoyed using our new road as well as role-playing using our 'traffic lights', 'petrol pump' and 'car wash'.

The children have quickly adapted to routines in the setting and our motto of 'Choose it, Use it and Put it away' and it is a pleasure to see all of our children engaged in their learning and making new friends.

We have had a brilliant first half term in FS2. The children have settled in quickly to our routines and are showing increasing independence. We have started our phonics and maths sessions and already children are making great progress. Some children are already blending sounds to read words! Thank you to all those families supporting your children with reading at home and to those that are completing homework in our yellow books each week.

The children have read the story 'The Colour Monster' which focuses on different emotions and we have discussed what makes us have different feelings. We have focused on developing our understanding of the words 'love' and 'calm'. We have learned about ways to keep ourselves calm when we become upset or feel angry.

The children have focused on developing their writing skills through fine motor activities such as daily Dough Disco and weekly 'Squiggle Whilst You Wiggle'. These fun activities take place alongside a lively piece of music and the children have shown a keen interest for these. Lots of Lego play and malleable activities such as playdough have supported our fine motor skills too.

As always, our children have lots of time to explore our continuous provision, engaging in learning both indoors and outdoors. We have particularly enjoyed building bridges, linked to our focus on 'The Gingerbread Man'. Lots of children explained that a bridge would have been a helpful for the Gingerbread Man to use to cross the river safely at the end of the story.

We have also noticed how the weather is changing and that leaves are starting to fall down from the trees. In FS2, we have enjoyed lots of discussions around Autumn changes. We have gone on walks around school and have used iPads to take photos of the changes.

We have loved talking about how we have all changed since we were babies. We have looked at photos of ourselves as babies, toddlers and now 4 and 5 year olds. Lots noticed how we have grown over time and how our hair has changed.

19 DECEMBER 2023

In Year two, we began our Geography unit comparing UK and Kenya by looking at our local area.

We have looked at map skills and directions as well as looking at human and physical features of Bolton-Upon -Dearne. We loved our walk around the local area, spotting lots of geographical features and identifying building use and then we drew our own maps to show our route. In science we have been finding out about animals including humans. We have discovered the basic needs of all animals and how they grow and change from young into adults.







In Literacy, we have finished our first writing unit based on 'The Owl who was Afraid of the Dark'. We have written some super model sentences to create a class version of the story. The children then worked so hard on their own story about a different animal that was afraid. We were really excited for our visit from the Owl man and now we are writing a non-chronological report about owls using the information we have found out! In maths we started the term by working on place value. Children have been learning the value of digits and partitioning a two digit number into tens and ones. We have started our next maths unit which is addition and subtraction where we will soon be learning how to add two-digit numbers!

We can't wait for the next part of our learning which looks at Kenya and our parent/carer session which is on Tuesday 21 November!

19 DECEMBER 2023

In Year 3 the children have been learning about Food and Farming UK. This has been a Geography focus where we have been thinking about where our food comes from, including looking at arable and pastoral farming as well as the different places around the world that our food comes from. We were lucky enough to be visited by a real farmer too, who helped us look at the different crops that can be grown in the UK. This has linked nicely with our DT work where we have been able to make fruit kebabs using fruits grown in other countries and thought about seasonal fruit and vegetables of the UK.

In Science, we have focussed on nutrition and considered how we can have a healthy diet as well as thinking about why certain food types are good or bad for us and why. The children have been able to group foods based on what nutrition they include and write a small food diary which they have been able to analyse and suggest improvements for.

In literacy, we have looked at the story of 'Star in the Jar' and then created our own stories about Tom and the Star. The children have focussed on the different features of writing that they could include, such as adjectives, similes and use of speech. As a class, we have been working on our letter formation too to get ready to join our writing.











AUTUMN TERM 2 YEAR 3

YEAR 3 PARENT SESSION

The children will be taking part in Stone Age activities linking with our history work. We will be learning about the Stone Age and how it is followed by the Bronze Age and Iron Age and thinking about the achievements of these civilizations. By joining us on our parent session we will be able to share our learning with parents

This half term, our learning has been all about 'Europe – Italy Focused'. As part of their geography learning, year 4 have learnt about the countries that make up Europe and their capital cities. What the physical geography of Italy is and how it compares to that of the UK, what the famous cities and landmarks are of Italy and how life in Italy compares to life in the UK.

As part of their science lessons, the children have learnt all about the digestive system, the different types of teeth in humans and their functions and how to construct and interpret a variety of food chains, identifying producers, predators and prey. They have taken part in a practical activity that represented the digestive system and observed what happens to the enamel on our teeth (hardboiled egg shells) when left in a variety of liquids.

They have also learnt in computing how to access Microsoft Office 365 to collaboratively learn. This has included contributing to a shared piece of work, creating a digital survey and creating and sharing a Mi-



This half term, in history, Year 6 have studied the impact of WWII on Britain. This included a fantastic educational visit to Cannon Hall Museum to experience a day in the life of evacuees.

We have learnt about what events led to the outbreak of World War 2. We also learnt about the Blitz and how this affected our locality, particularly our closest city of Sheffield. We looked at what it was like for those who were evacuated and how the role of women changed during this period. We spent time learning about the legacy of the World War on Britain.

In science we having been learning about light. We learnt that light travels in straight lines and what happens to light when it travels through prisms and water. We looked at light sources, what happens when we see and what happens to our eye when it is too light or too dark. We looked at reflection and how that can help us see behind us or around things. Finally, we looked at shadows and how they have the same shape as the object that cast them.

In RE, we have looked at the Sikh faith. We learnt more about their sacred text, the Guru Granth Sahib, why it is so special and how it is treated. We also learnt about significant and special places to Sikhs. This included learning about the importance of the Gurdwara, some of its features and pilgrimages around the world that Sikhs undertake.

In our computing lessons, we have focused on the importance of secret codes and Bletchley Park during WW2. We also looked at significant individuals who have had an impact on computer science today. We created a presentation and shared our findings with each other.

In DT, we designed and made a stuffed toy for an evacuee in wartime. We practised previously taught sewing skills as well as adding additional details.

In PE we have been working on two separate units. The first unit looked at was developing dribbling and passing skills across a range of sports including hockey, football and basketball. The second unit was handball.
