Over the years, well-known companies such as Marvel and Pixar have released many comics that have since been turned into films. These story lines, although different, contain similar themes, character types and plot structures that you can use to help you create your own superhero story. What is usually included in a superhero story? -superhero with superhuman powers/gifts, wants peace and wears a 'cool' costume -villain with superhuman powers/gifts, wants power/wealth overall and wears a 'cool' costume -innocent victims who are usually humans and cities caught in the middle -sometimes the costumes they wear support or enhance their powers/strengths/abilities -the villain usually tries to take over the world/planet/city and there is a huge battle
