Homework Book Activity - To use a wider range of cohesive devices. Grammar challenge The term 'cohesive devices' refers to the conjunctions, connectives and pronouns used to link the parts of a piece of writing. Using the same verb tense throughout a text also offers 'cohesion'. Basically, when a person's writing has cohesion, an attempt has been made to link clauses, sentences and paragraphs so that the writing 'hangs together'.	Homework Book Activity - to write a non-chronological report about Antarctica. Write a non-chronological report about any aspect of Antarctica you are interested in. There is a link to a website which has various sections with information about every aspect of Antarctica you can think of. On some there are even cool clips to watch.
